### About the workshop

For many Australian universities student plagiarism became an issue around 2003 and some can now claim to lead the world in their approaches to the issue. Yet plagiarism and student integrity are in some ways more difficult to manage in 2011 than they were a decade ago. For example, there are new opportunities for students to fake assignments; new pressures on students to succeed; new challenges arising from diversity of students' previous experiences; and more time pressure on teachers.

This workshop will examine current issues in managing student plagiarism and academic integrity. It will provide a world-wide review of approaches plus provide activities and case study examples of how interventions may be applied. Participants will have opportunities to discuss approaches and to consider the potential to modify their own practices.

### About Jude Carroll

Jude began work several decades ago at the Oxford Centre of Learning and Staff Development (OCSLD), Oxford Brookes University and worked as Deputy Director of a HEFCE-funded, Centre for Excellence in Teaching and Learning known as ASKe (Assessment Standards Knowledge Exchange). From 2009-2011, she also co-managed the Teaching International Students (TIS) project with Dr Janette Ryan from Monash University. The TIS project was funded by the UK government and the Higher Education Academy with the aim of enhancing the learning experience of international students.

Jude is the author of *The Handbook for Deterring Plagiarism in Higher Education* (2007, 2nd ed) and co-edited the widely used text *Teaching International Students: improving learning for all* (2005: Routledge). In 2009, Jude was awarded a National Teaching Fellowship in recognition of her work and remains a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy.
